Notes from the Superintendent

It is my pleasure to welcome students and families back to the start of another school year. This newsletter is intended to keep district patrons and families informed about our district and communicate important information about the start of the school year. There is also information in the newsletter about other aspects of our district.

This year's school calendar is very similar to last year's. The calendar can be found on our website and printed copies will be available at enrollment or in the offices. You can also download the Google calendar to your smartphone or other device.

As we begin another school year, the word that keeps coming to mind is optimism. Things are not all rosy quite yet, but after a few years of flat funding and a state legislature that seemed to loathe the idea of public education; our state is now headed in a positive direction regarding public school funding and policy. It has been a few years since I've been able to report any positive news about our school budget.

One of the necessary cuts last year was the elimination of the elementary principal position. As superintendent, I took on those duties. The Board determined last spring that we did not have enough budget information to know if it

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Student Enrollment - August 8th Noon-7:00pm

Student registration will be held in the cafeteria from 12:00 noon until 7:00 pm on Tues, Aug. 8th. Please enter the doors on the north side of the building.

Enrollment packets have been mailed to all families. This helps us streamline the enrollment process for everyone. Families with new students may pick up a packet at enrollment or in the district office before Aug. 8th. Enrollment forms are also available on our website.

Proof of identity must be provided for students enrolling in a school district for the <u>first time</u>. Proof of identity can be a birth certificate, a copy of a court order placing a child in the custody of DCF, or a certified transcript or similar pupil records from another school district where the student was previously enrolled.

A doctor's physical is required for students who are enrolling for the first time in the state of Kansas. Students who were previously enrolled at USD 350 or another school do not need to have an additional physical exam. You should contact the Health Department or your doctor if an exam is required.

To enroll in kindergarten, a student must be 5 years old on or before Aug 31st. To enroll in first grade, students must be 6 years old on or before Aug 31st OR have completed an accredited Kindergarten program. These age limits are established by state law and the school district has no flexibility to adjust these requirements.

On the surface, it seems easy to reduce costs by cutting administrative positions. However, this is not an ideal situation. Our kids and our teachers need a great principal who can devote proper time and energy to provide quality leadership for our elementary school. At this point, the Board's goal is to search for an elementary principal to take over in the 2018-19 school year. Mr. Olive will continue to serve as Jr/Sr High principal.

We've got some exciting things going on in our district this year. We've added Chromebooks to the 5th & 6th grades so we are now one-to-one from 5th grade through high school. Mr. Delp has been building a high tunnel greenhouse to use with his Environmental Resources & Wildlife class. We will be implementing a new reading curriculum in the elementary grades.

Our staff always stays focused on our mission to "ensure that students will find their purpose and become successful, lifelong learners and positive contributors in a changing world." LIFE After-School Program

The L.I.F.E. After-School Program is available to all students (K– 4th grade) enrolled in USD 350. The federal grant is no longer available to fund our program. To help with costs, we have increased the enrollment fee and are limiting enrollment to 4th grade and below. The program runs every day immediately after school until 5:10 pm. We provide a snack, an academic lesson and a variety of other fun, age-appropriate activities. The elementary program is on an enrollment basis and has a low monthly fee. Parents/guardians may choose to send their student five days a week or pick the days that best meet their needs.

On a non-enrollment, no cost basis, we also have tutors available to assist any K-12 student with their school work. Tutors are available for one hour each day after school. This service is also located in the library. Students may come in as needed for tutoring.

Information about LIFE will be available at enrollment.

Office Locations

It is important to us that guest feel welcome in our schools. It is also important for to ensure that students are safe in the buildings.

The elementary and district offices are combined. The entrance is at the corner of <u>5th and</u> <u>Monroe</u> just north of the library. Anyone entering the school must enter into the office to check in. This helps us ensure a safe and secure building for our students.

The only two public entrances during the school day are the one at 5th & Monroe for the Elementary and District offices and the one at the North end near the main gym for the Jr/Sr High office. All other entrances will be locked during the school day. Visitors must always check in at one of the offices.

Early Education at USD 350

It is the goal of USD 350 to provide preschool for all children starting at age 3. Preschool students attend class for a half day Monday through Thursday in the morning or the afternoon. The first day of preschool is Mon, Aug. 28th.

Our preschool is operated by the special education cooperative in Pratt. Students must go through the screening process to be eligible to attend preschool. The next screening will be Thu, Aug 17 at the Church of Christ. Call 620-549-3504 to make an appointment.

For the most part, children must also be toilet trained before attending preschool. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact the elementary office. We look forward to seeing you at enrollment.

Student Insurance

The school district provides supplementary accident insurance for students while they are at school or participating in an extra-curricular activity. This is not intended to be the primary insurance coverage for students. It is meant to be secondary coverage and therefore provides limited coverage and benefits that <u>do not cover all</u> medical costs.

USD 350 Board of Education

From the Nurse's Office

Please stop by the Nurse's table at enrollment to sign the Kansas Immunization registry permission form if you have not in the past. Also, please bring the following to enrollment:

- Doctor's orders for medication needed at school
- Doctor's orders for any health issues
- Doctor's orders for an epi pen if your child has a severe allergy
- Physical completed in the last 12 months if your child is a new student under the age of nine.
- Updated immunizations if you received a letter in May or your child is new to the district

All kindergarteners should bring:

- Physical completed in the last 12 months
- Current immunization record

*All athletes are required to have a new physical exam completed each school year (after May 1, 2017). Athletes must have a state-approved physical form turned into the office before they may participate.

Practices begin August 14th

<u>6th grade students</u> may participate in junior high sports if participation numbers allow. Girls may participate in volleyball and all may participate in cross country. State law does not allow 6th graders to play football. Information about signup will be available at enrollment.

Stafford County Health Department will be at enrollment to update student's immunizations. **Call Doris at 549-3504** and let her know if your child would like to get a vaccine and which vaccine he/she needs.

Students who are currently out of compliance according to school records will receive a letter before enrollment. If your student is in 5th, 6th or 7th grade and have not received their Tdap this would be a great time to get that vaccine!

Preliminary Budget Information

We have been working under the block grant system of funding for the past two years. When the legislature passed this law, it was meant to be temporary. After waiting two years for a quality solution, the legislature finally passed a bill at the very end of the session. We are now waiting on the Supreme Court to issue a ruling on the constitutionality of the new law. We anticipate a ruling very soon (perhaps even by the time you read this newsletter). At this point, we are working under the assumption that the new law will be deemed constitutional.

I would prefer to give budget specifics in this newsletter, but I cannot do so at this time. In a typical year, we would already have a budget published and ready for public hearing by now. Without a final budget ready, I can only provide some general information.

There are three main points that are all positive for our budget. First is that the overall property valuation has increased by about 14%. This means that we could see a decrease in the overall mill levy for the school district. Much of this increase is due to oil and gas valuation.

Second is that we are in a good financial position starting out this year. For a number of years, our operational cash balance has been on the decline; we were spending more than we were taking in. The board has worked to reduce expenses and has turned this situation around the last couple of years. We are in a better position than we have been since 2010.

The third point is that we will see a bit of new money from the state. The new funding law, assuming that it stands, will provide our district with about \$60,000 more in state funding for this year. This amounts to about 1.2% of our budget. While this is barely enough to cover our increased costs, at least it is a step in the right direction.

Specifics about the budget will be available once the Court has ruled and we have time to finalize everything. The budget will be published in the St. John News and the Board will hold a public hearing before approving the 2017-18 budget.

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New Faces at USD 350

We are blessed to have a great staff in our school district. As is usual every year, there will be a few new faces in our buildings this fall.

Mike Manderino is our new high school English teacher and assistant junior high football coach. He was working as a resource teacher in Pratt before coming on board at SJH. Mr. Manderino has 26 years of teaching experience in PE and language arts at the high school and college level.

Katie Jensen will be supervising our distance learning program for high school Spanish. Mrs. Jensen lives here in St. John with her husband and daughter and has been working periodically in our library. She has a degree in Spanish.

Adam Moritz is our new industrial arts teacher. He comes to us from Stafford schools but he and his wife have lived in St. John for a couple of years. Mr. Moritz grew up in Hays where his father is also an industrial arts teacher.

While she is not new to our school system, Roxanna Vicars will be moving to a new position. She will be teaching second grade this year. She was previously employed by our special education cooperative and taught preschool here in St. John.

Cindy Allen has agreed to come out of retirement and help us with preschool this year. She will be taking over Ms. Rox's classroom as she moves over to second grade. Mrs. Allen taught for many years before retiring three years ago. We are glad to have her back with us, even if only for one year.

Mike Joiner has been selected as our new high school head football coach. He has been a pastor and worked in the oil industry. Coach Joiner grew up in Ellinwood. He has already been hard at work with the boys this summer. Reuben Martin has moved up from the junior high program to be the high school assistant coach.

Josh Lopez will be coaching the junior high football team this year. Coach Lopez grew up in Great Bend and played

football at Dodge City CC.

Stephanie Smith will be working in the high school office now. She was working as a paraprofessional in the preschool, but will now replace Zoe Staub as the high school secretary.

Kristen Knight is transitioning from the learning center to elementary music. Mrs. Knight has served our district as a teacher's aide and the director of the learning center. She taught elementary music in Eudora before moving to Stafford County.

At the time of this writing we have some paraprofessional positions left to fill, so you will see a few new faces in addition to the ones listed above.

We are excited to have these new staff members on the USD 350 team. Please make our new staff feel welcome in our school system. know they will do a great job for our students.



Substitute Positions

We are always looking for great <u>substitute teachers</u> for our classrooms. Substitute teachers earn \$95 per day and can find some work on most school days.

Substitute teachers must be licensed. However, it is not required to have a bachelor's degree. Anyone with 60 or more college credit hours may apply for a license with the KS State Dept of Education. We can help with the licensing process.
