SUPERINTENDENT'S NEWS

Another Mid-Winter Classic basketball tournament has come and gone. This is a great community event put on by our local Lions Club. It is a long-running tournament with this being the 49th year. This tournament brings a lot of people into our school and is a good fundraiser for the Lion's Club. It takes a lot of community volunteers to make it work and they deserve appreciation. I'd like to express thanks to Rick Hunley and all of the Lions Club volunteers for their efforts to put together such a great event. Even though the Tigers did not win the championship, the tournament was a success.

This will be the third year in a row that my February article has contained information about a struggling state budget and the efforts to fix education funding in Kansas. Three years in a row and there does not appear to be an end in sight.

As legislators look to fill a \$350 million budget hole, a bill was just introduced to fix it with across the board spending cuts for all state funded programs. Estimates put USD 350's share of these cuts at \$200,000. A cut this deep would be devastating to our schools.

I do not anticipate a cut that large, however cuts are a real possibility. Any cuts will be difficult to manage since we are now more than half the way through the year and much of the budget has already been spent.

The block grant formula for funding education is set to expire at the end of this year. Legislators must draft a new school funding formula before July 1. This will be difficult to accomplish this since little work has been done on this to date. There is a real possibility that the block grants will remain in place with flat funding for another year. The state Supreme Court has yet to rule on the school finance case. This ruling will have a significant effect on what legislators choose to do this session.

Think about grade cards and what it means when a 3rd grader has a "C" in math class? Consider two example students who both earn a C in math. Perhaps Student 1 does not quite grasp all of the math concepts, but works hard and turns in all of the work. Maybe Student 2 has a firm understanding of the math, but does not complete all assignments and misbehaves now and again. In this example, Student 1 and Student 2 earned the same grade, but they are obviously performing at different levels. The grade we see on the report card might be based on a combination of the students' knowledge gained, work ethic, behavior, and other factors.

In the elementary grades, we are working to be more specific with reporting what stu-

dents know and are able to do. Standards-based grading is a way to do this. Staff is working toward implementing standards-based grade cards in the lower elementary grades next year. This is something that has been done for years in our Kindergarten classes. More information will be coming to parents about this in the coming months.

Good attendance in school is one of the most important factors in student success. Here are a few facts about school attendance from the national group Attendance Works. Research

shows that missing 10 percent of the school, or about 17 days, negatively affects a student's academic performance. That is about two days a month and is known as chronic absence. By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school.

The academic impact of missing that much school is the same whether the absences are excused or unexcused. When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects and chances for graduating. It is critically important for parents to help us ensure that students get to school every day, ready to learn.


