Superintendent's News

There are always reasons for us to get worried or angry. Whether it's hurricanes, water rights issues, the town grocery store, or national anthem protests, many things affect our lives. Some things we can control and others we cannot.

Sometimes we can still have an influence on these things we cannot control. Author Stephen Covey talks about the "circle of influence" compared to the "circle of concern." When we focus too much on issues outside of our circle of influence, this causes stress. The goal is to invest our time, effort, and worry on those things we can control, or at least influence.

One thing we do not control is mandates from the state. The KS Department of Education has developed a new system of accreditation. Each year the state determines whether school



districts are accredited. In past years, the focus was only on test scores in reading and math. The state is now focused on five primary outcomes. They are: 1) high school graduation rate, 2) success after high school, 3) kindergarten readiness 4) social, emotional, and character, and 5) individual plans of study for every student. I'll be sharing more information about these outcomes throughout the school year. Another item that is out of our control is the outcome of the Supreme Court's school finance case. We are still waiting on a ruling. This ruling has the potential

to have a big impact on the upcoming legislative session. I'm certain that one issue that will be discussed is carryover cash balances held by school districts. Some assert that Kansas school districts are holding too much money in reserve that could be spent to educate kids.

There are many reasons why school districts have money in reserve. I cannot answer for other school districts, but for USD 350, our goal is to have about two months' worth of expenses in reserve at the end of the year. This amounts to about 16% of yearly operational expenses. As of July 2017, we are a bit short of that goal at 12% of expenses. We carry over funds in July in order manage cash flow through the year and take care of unexpected expenses that may arise.

One must also consider that we receive 19% of our state aid in June. This is after the school year when most expenses are already paid for the year. Essentially, this money must be held in reserve to start the new school year.

Each year, the official enrollment for school districts is counted on September 20th. This year our K-12 student count is right at 300. This is down about 22 from last year. Most of this was expected and is due to losing a large senior class and bringing in a small Kindergarten class. While it's difficult to predict, the enrollment trend seems to be flat for the foreseeable future. For sports and activities, SIH is classified as a IA school this year.

Good attendance in school is one of the most important factors in student success. Here are a few facts about school attendance from the national group Attendance Works. Research shows that missing 10 percent of the school, or about 17 days, negatively affects a student's academic performance. That is about two days a month and is known as chronic absence. By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school.



The academic impact of missing that much school is the same whether the absences are excused or unexcused. When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects and chances for graduating. It is critically important for parents to help us ensure that students get to school every day, ready to learn.

Jr./Sr. High Conferences to Take on New Format

This year, some changes will be made to our parent-teacher conferences. Instead of the traditional teacher-led conferences where parents visit each of their child's teachers and the child is usually not present, we are transitioning to a student-led model. With this set-up, students attend and lead discussions with their parents about a variety of items. These discussions will take place in the classroom of the students' L/S teachers.

Among areas that will be covered are potential career interests identified through Career Cruising, an online self-exploration and planning tool utilized by



the school. This can then lead to further discussions between the child and parent such as potential colleges or technical Parent-Teacher schools offering postsecondary training in this area, opportunities to job shadow, and courses students should be taking during their high school career. Time will also be devoted to discussing grades and items re-

lated to classroom performance. I anticipate that this student-led conference will last about 10 to 15 minutes.

To provide more information on these conferences and reasons for making the change, I will be providing a brief presentation at the top of each hour (3:00, 4:00, 5:00, 6:00, 7:00, and 8:00) on this evening for anyone interested. After that time, you could head to your student-led conferences to begin discussions with your child.

For these conferences to truly be effective and relevant discussions held, it is important that both the student and parent are in attendance. After the conference is complete, parents will have the opportunity to visit some of their child's teachers if they choose. However, I believe with this new format and discussions already being held between the parent and student about classroom performance, it will not be necessary to visit every teacher.

As the October 23 date draws closer, letters will be sent home with more information about this night. I am looking forward to a new set-up and productive night that will benefit our students. ~ Travis Olive, Principal
