Superintendent's News

We have many rights afforded to us in the United States. Which one is most important? The right to free speech? The right to keep and bear arms? Although the right to vote is not explicitly mentioned in our Constitution, the right to vote shows up five times in Constitutional amendments. This shows that the people have determined that the right to vote is one of the most important rights we have as citizens.

The general election is coming up on November 6th. Advanced voting is open now through noon on November 5th. My hope is that no one takes their right to vote for granted. Every vote matters.

By now, I'm sure that most citizens in Stafford County are aware of the water issue that is threatening our local economy. This water impairment conflict stands to have a dramatic and negative impact on our communities and school districts. The total impact on our economy could be between \$30 and \$125 million per year. Our school board took action to suspend all activities with Quivira National Wildlife Refuge. The board also signed on to a letter with other government agencies in the county asking for resolution. This letter was sent to the US Department of Interior and other relevant decision makers.



The impact on our community, and in turn our school district, is so great that our board felt that this was something we could not ignore. As it currently stands, decisions made by our government could take dollars from our economy and affect the livelihood of hard working Kansans. We see this as an issue where our federal government is sacrificing the good of thousands of people in our area for recreation and tourism at Quivira NWR.

Local producers and the groundwater management district have been working on this issue for many years. Their proposed solution of pumping directly at the refuge was rejected by government officials. We have so many positive things going on in our community. It is frustrating to have this negativity brought on by perceived government overreach.



Many people have asked what they can do. I would suggest educating yourself on the issue first. Then you can call or write your US Senators or Representative and the KS secretary of agriculture and ask for their help. You can find copies of the letters signed by our board on our website. You can also find a lot of information on the GMD#5 website.

E-cigarette use among youth has become epidemic and is a concern for school staff and parents. The most popular of the e-cigarettes is the Juul. It is easy to conceal because it looks like a USB flash drive. These Juul devices, and others like them are terribly addictive. One pod in a Juul device contains as much nicotine as an entire pack of cigarettes. It is important to note that electronic cigarettes are not healthy. This might seem obvious to most, but there is a misconception that "vaping" is not harmful.


School board policy prohibits the use or possession of any tobacco product or nicotine delivery device (like an e-cigarette). There is helpful information posted on our website. Parents should contact the school office with any questions or concerns about this.

I want to remind parents that the school doors do not open until 7:30am each day. We do not have staff on hand to supervise before then. Students dropped off before that time must wait outside for the doors to be unlocked. This becomes a concern as the weather gets colder, so please do send students to school before 7:30.

After she emailed the company, explaining that we have a small Kansas high school with limited seating, assuring the company that the size and location of the high school would not likely compete with any other productions in Kansas or surrounding areas, they kindly relented and allowed us the permission to present the play. *Carousel's* music was composed by Richard Rodgers; the lyrics and script were written by Oscar Hammerstein, Jr. The story is based on a play," Liliom," written by Ferenc Molnar, as adapted by Benjamin F. Glazer.

The story line follows **Billy Bigelow**, a brash young man who runs a carousel (merry-go-round) at a local fair. He falls in love with a very shy, yet loyal, young lady named **Julie Jordan**.
