## Superintendent's News

It is time to start thinking about enrollment for next school year. Children 3 years of age or older by August 31, 2014 are eligible to attend preschool and children 5 years of age or older by August 31, 2014 are eligible to attend kindergarten.

The first step to having your preschool or Kindergarten child enrolled at USD 350 is to have your child screened. Children **MUST** be screened before they can attend preschool. Preschool screening and kindergarten round-up will be held at the Church of Christ, 609 North Pearl, in St. John, on the following dates: Thursday, April 10 for potential kindergarten students and Friday, April 25 for potential preschoolers.

We ask that if you have a child who will be in Kindergarten or preschool next year that you submit a form to the elementary office. If you missed the March 31st deadline, please submit the form as soon as possible. A form was sent home to many parents, but we may have missed some families. You can find the form on our school website and you may contact the elementary office with questions about this at 549-3518.



The Board of Education recently approved the school calendar for the 2014-15 school year. The school year for students will run from August 21, 2014 through May 19, 2015. The scheduled days are very similar to the current year's calendar. A copy of the calendar can be found on our website.

I'm sure you already know that the Tiger boys brought home another state basketball championship. We congratulate Coach Kinnamon and the team for achieving this milestone two years in a row. The team and crowd were a positive representation of our community at the tournament.

The current legislative session is now being dominated by issues addressed by the Kansas Supreme Court in their recent school finance ruling.

There are two issues at hand with this court ruling. First is equity (is funding equitable across the state?) and second is adequacy (is it enough?). The equity issue has to do with state aid provided to districts for their local option budget (LOB) and capital outlay funds.

This aid is provided to districts with lower property wealth to equalize funding across the state. This is needed because one mill of tax authority generates a vastly different dollar amount from school district to school district.

Currently, state aid is not provided as it should be according to Kansas statute. Less than 80% of the LOB aid is provided and capital outlay aid is not funded at all. This does not affect our budget because USD 350 gets no state aid for these funds; the revenue is only collected from local tax payers.



The Supreme Court ruled that the legislature is not meeting their Constitutional obligation to properly equalize funding for capital outlay and local option budgets. There are basically two ways to solve this problem. One option is to add nearly \$130 million to fully fund the equalization aid. This would not affect the USD 350 budget since we receive none of this aid.


Another option would be to provide this equalization aid from other areas of the public education budget. In effect, this would mean taking money from districts that do not receive this state funding (like USD 350) and spreading it out to those districts that do. While funding equity is very important, it should not come at the expense of some school districts with already strapped school budgets.

In regard to adequacy, the Supreme Court disagreed with the lower court about the amount needed to properly fund schools according to the Constitution. The Supreme Court sent this back to the lower court to reconsider. The Court said that outcomes for students must be considered in determining whether funding is adequate or not. It is not merely a matter of "how much money" is spent. The issue of funding adequacy will likely not be agreed upon any time soon. # JUNIOR-SENIOR PLAY

*APRIL 12 AND 13, 2014*

The Junior Senior Play this spring will be presented Saturday, April 12, at 7:30 p.m., and Sunday, April 13, at 2:00 p.m., 2014, in the St. John High School Auditorium. The title this year is *Curtain Going Up!*, A COMEDY IN THREE ACTS, by Gregory Johnston. Rights to perform the play have been obtained from Samuel French, Inc., 45 West 25th Street, New York, NY 10010. This is a very clever and humorous play about the “production of a play in high school, [during which] the action takes place on the stage and in the auditorium, during rehearsal and after the presentation,” according to the play book. The teacher in charge of her very first school play is portrayed by senior Madison Long. She has seemingly every problem getting this



“play within the play” to performance that can possibly happen, including: misplaced or stolen play books; students coming close to failing classes and thus being close to being ineligible at the last moment;; a grouchy and temperamental custodian who believes in some way that he should be in charge (senior Preston Miller); a faculty member in charge of costumes (Maddy Lippoldt) who is vying for the affection of the journalism teacher (Tim Easley) who is actually smitten with the new teacher this year; a father (Jesus Alvarez) who believes his daughter (Haley Falk), a real prima donna, should have the leading role over a new actress (Taylor Woodward) who has become enthralled with the theater; a Broadway actress (Khloe Clark) who is the aunt of one of the male cast members (Austin White), a real male prima donna, and feels she has much more experience than the new high school teacher who is trying to produce the play. The senior class sponsor (Emily Nevil) adds her own pressure to the teacher/director by cutting her play budget in half.

Other student actors involved in the play-within-the-play as well as in the play proper are Schuyler Brown (who is a jealous boyfriend-type in the cast because he is protecting his right to his girlfriend’s affections); Zuriel Reyes (who portrays an ornery, ladies’-man type sure to keep things stirred up); Jessica Hanson (who plays a very frustrated stage manager trying her best to keep the cast in line); Kade Kinnamon (an athlete with no acting experience trying to keep stage directions clear in his mind and breaking character several times because he cannot remember where to enter and stand... plus he doesn’t know how his teammates will react to his costume and makeup);

The Sub-State and State Basketball Tournaments with the wonderful involvement of teams and fans, plus spring break, the beginning of track and golf seasons, music, and, of course, after school jobs and their work in the classroom all take the lions' share of their energies. The way they manage all those activities is really something. They will try their best in this very involved play. This will be, by the way, the seniors' last performance on the St. John High Stage. 


## April Photography Exhibit to Showcase Local Photographers



## 2014 Talk About Literature in Kansas Features New York Times Best Seller



**Ida Long Goodman Memorial Library** has offered a three-part book discussion series February through April on the theme "Growing Up." All are invited to attend the free programs. The books, provided by the Kansas Humanities Council, are available for checkout. The last book discussion will feature *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-time* by Mark Haddon on April 27th at 3:30.

The following is a review of *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-time* by schmoop.com.

[Mark Haddon](#) was an author and illustrator of children's books, who one day decided to write a book for adults

instead. An image popped into his head – of a dead poodle in someone's front lawn, stabbed with a pitchfork – and he thought it was just about the funniest thing in the world ([source](#)). Hmm, okay, Mark.

But before we give him the old "you're nuts" treatment, let's take a look at what that turned into. From that image alone, Haddon created the immensely successful *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time*. It has sold millions of copies (tens of millions, really), won the prestigious Whitbread Award in 2003, and today can be found in bookstores in just about every country in the world ([source](#)).

So, what's it all about, then? Haddon's first journey into adult novels tells the story of a fifteen-year-old boy named Christopher Boone, who finds – you guessed it – a dead dog in his neighbor's yard. On the back of most editions of the book, Christopher is described as having [Asperger syndrome](#), an autism spectrum disorder that makes social interactions difficult and uncomfortable. While this the book certainly seems

to describe Christopher's experience in the world, his disorder is actually never specified in the book

A fan of Sherlock Holmes stories, Christopher decides to do some detective work of his own, and solve the mystery of who killed the pup. Along the way, he discovers a whole lot more than he expected – both about himself and about parts of the world he never knew existed. But the book is a precious gem on its own (we feel precious for even putting it that way, but it's true!), as Christopher jumps from advanced astrophysics to the existence of God, from quadratic equations to his favorite animals at the zoo. Christopher's narrative voice is unlike any in literary history, and, against all odds, he makes a wonderful guide for this fascinating journey. (Schmoop Editorial Team)


