SUPERINTENDENT'S NEWS

Before I write my article each month I will usually look back at past years' articles to see if there are things I need bring up during a particular time of year. When I looked back at the article from March 2019, I read the following words:

"I am sad to see that Representative Greg Lewis resigned his position in the Kansas House of Representatives. Greg is a great man and has been an advocate for public education and the kids in our community, among other things. I admire him for making tough decisions based on what is best for the people he represents. He never got his marching orders from special interest groups or was beholden to any outside interests. That genuine statesmanship seems to be a rarity in our political climate today. Thank you, Rep. Lewis for your service."

One year after Rep. Lewis resigned from office, he left this mortal world for a better home with the Lord. In this politically charged atmosphere where it seems we are constantly forced to pick one side or the other, Greg exemplified the idea of doing what is right regardless of political aspirations or affiliations. More should follow his example. His service to the state, our community, our school district, and his family is to be admired.

In addition to our typical school activities like sports and music, we have a few new things going on. The 6th grade robotics team recently took four teams to Garden City for a competition. All four teams made it to the finals. The team of Juan Ibarra and Maylin Sanders brought home the first place trophy in the overall team driving competition. Earlier in the month, the team competed in Ness City where Frances Duntz and Jace Reyes placed 10th and Juan and Maylin were 2nd. We are proud of our students and their coach Danny Smith.

Students in grades six and up have the opportunity to participate in a trap shooting club this sprint. Allen Adams and Tom Fischer are organizing the club. Students will compete in the Kansas Clay Target League where they shoot locally and submit scores online. The state competition will be held in Sedgwick in June.

Early education is an important focus for our district. Our goal is to ensure that every student who enters Kindergarten is ready to learn. Our district offers free preschool for all students ages 3 and up. All new



preschool students MUST attend a screening to be eligible to attend our preschool. The screenings help us identify specific student needs and help us plan for the upcoming school year.

There will be a preschool screening on Thursday, March 26th from 9:00-3:00 at the Church of Christ in St. John. Call 620-549-3504 to schedule an appointment. Other screenings are available but this is the only one held in St. John. Contact the elemen-

tary office with any questions.

Kindergarten Roundup will be held on April 17th also at the Church of Christ. More information about roundup will be coming next month.
