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## Superintendent's Corner

The school year is well underway and we are off to a great start. Recently we had our enrollment count day and initial figures show that our enrollment is down slightly from last year. In past years, enrollment was very important since that determined our budget for the year. With the two year block grant funding system, enrollment figures do not matter.

The Board of Education approved the 2015-16 budget at their September meeting. This year's budget was affected dramatically by a 21% drop in property valuation. This decrease was due to the decrease in oil and gas prices. Because of this, we applied for and were awarded additional funding from the state's "extraordinary need" fund. We are set to receive an additional \$150,000 in aid this year to make up for lost revenue from the valuation decline.

Without this additional aid, the mill levy would have increased by over 8 mills to maintain the same budget as last year. With the extraordinary need aid, the mill levy has increased 3.4 mills from last year. While the mill levy is higher, actual taxes levied went down dramatically from \$2.1 million down to \$1.7 million (-16%). This shows how much the district's budget depends on property values. This budget is still tight but will allow us continue to improve the district as the community expects.



Recently, our district was in the news because we are actively looking for a math teacher for next school year. Typically, we would not start looking to hire for next year until the spring. However, there is a shortage of teachers in Kansas, particularly in the areas of math and science. Some districts in Kansas were not able to fill some of their teaching positions. We don't want to be in this position, so we have started as early as possible to find a replacement for Mr. Wood next year.

The board has placed a high priority on recruiting and retaining great teachers. This takes time and effort, but is one of the most important jobs we have to do. We are fortunate to have hired seven great teachers into our district this year.



One issue that will compound this problem are the changes to the public employees' retirement system (KPERS). In past years, schools could hire retired teachers to fill open teaching positions. The district would pay a surcharge since retired teachers no longer contribute to the retirement system. Changes now require that a retired teacher can be paid a maximum of \$25,000 per year. This effectively removes all retired teachers from the hiring pool for a full-time position.

I try to avoid being very political in my regular column. However, decisions by our legislature have an effect on our school and our students. This community expects us to put the best teachers in our classrooms. This change to the teacher retirement system has a detrimental effect on our ability to do that.

You might see some SJH students out and about in the community as part of our internship program. Learning in a classroom with a teacher is a very effective way to learn. However, real work experiences provide students with opportunities to explore careers and practice employability skills. Students earn credit for participating in internships just as they would any other high school course.
