

## Skyline Invitational Cross Country Meet Results for St. John

The St. John Cross Country team traveled to Pratt for the Skyline Invitational on a cool and cloudy Saturday. Skyline hosted 10 schools at the meet.

The Varsity boys team beat out the rest of the competition to win their second meet of the year. The Tiger team was led by A.J. Miller with a time of 18:34.56 and a 6<sup>th</sup> place medal. Other medalists for the Varsity boys were Wrangler Walker 11<sup>th</sup> (19:32), Hunter Hanson 12<sup>th</sup> (19:33), Cashe McVey 13<sup>th</sup> (19:35), Uriel Calleros 14<sup>th</sup> (19:40) and Dylan Reed 18<sup>th</sup> (20:00). Trey Fisher was 24<sup>th</sup> with a time of 20:17. "We had a nice pack form runners 2-5, but we have too big of a gap to our top runner. Our first two miles were decent, but we are going to have to be tougher the last mile. We will get back to work this week and hopefully bring our times down." Coach Delp

In the Varsity girls race, Jackie Rios earned a 15<sup>th</sup> place medal with a time of 26:23 and Jaden Reed earned a 19<sup>th</sup> place medal with a time of 28:00. Dalton Nemec took first place with a time of 20:21 in the JV boys race. Other JV boys who medaled were Nick Huston 11<sup>th</sup> (25:15) and Sead Pepic 14<sup>th</sup> (25:54). Ethan Huston was 16<sup>th</sup> (26:02) and Edson Gracia 21<sup>st</sup> (31:14). Jordon Willinger competed in her first cross country race for the JV girls. She earned a 10<sup>th</sup> place medal with a time of 34:14.

In the 7<sup>th</sup> grade boys race, Quade Smith ran a 6:25 to earn a 4<sup>th</sup> place medal. Chris Fernandez finished 21<sup>st</sup> with a time of 9:36. In the 8<sup>th</sup> grade girls race, August Siefkes earned a 2<sup>nd</sup> place medal with a time of 14:31. Mackenzie Hacker finished in 9<sup>th</sup> place with a time of 17:23.
