Superintendent's News

As the final days of school come to a close, we have a lot of activities planned: banquets, concerts, awards assemblies, field trips, and sports events. For many kids, the countdown to the end of school has begun. The class of 2019 is looking forward to their upcoming commencement ceremony.

We often think of graduation as an ending. Actually, the word commencement means beginning. This event marks the end of their years at St. John High School, but it marks the beginning of the rest of their lives. As they move into the next phase of their lives, we wish the senior class of 2019 all the best.

The last day for our senior class is May 14th. We will celebrate these students' accomplishments at the Senior Class Night on Thursday, May 16th at 7:00pm in the auditorium. Commencement will be held at 4:00 in the main gym on Saturday, May 18th.

The last day of school for the other students is May 21st. School will dismiss at 11:00 that day and lunch will not be served. This is a busy time with many activities and ceremonies to celebrate student accomplishments. 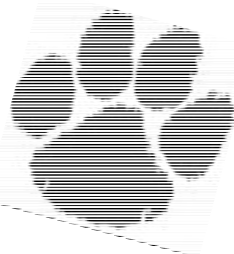

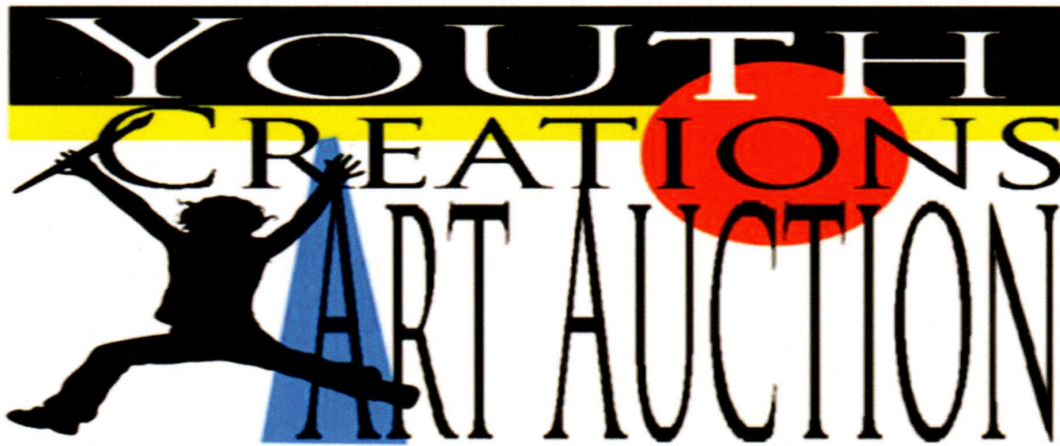

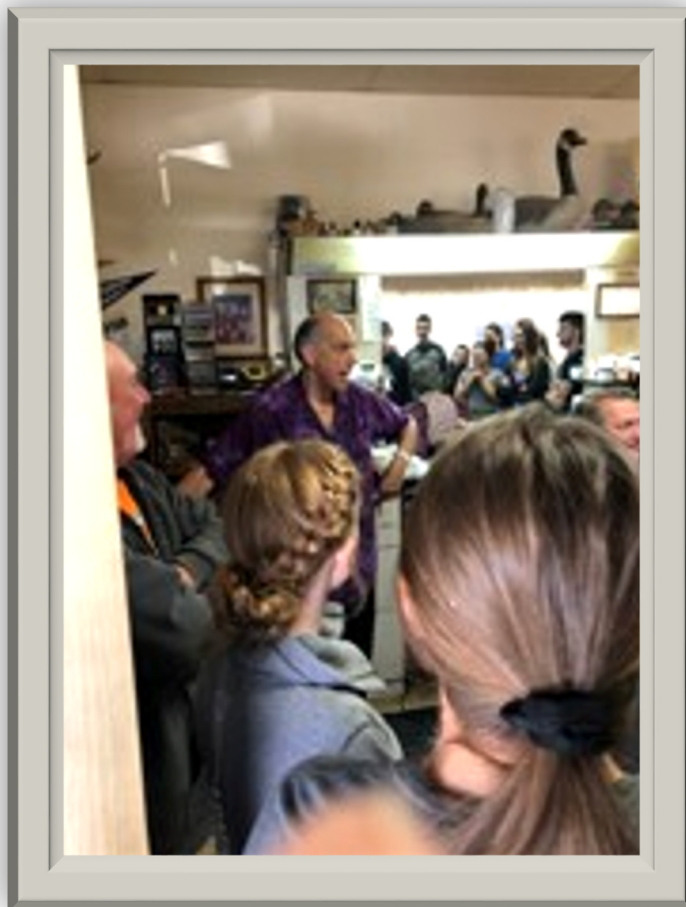

My name is Danny Smith and I am the High School Girl's Basketball coach at St. John High School. This summer will be the twelfth year of this summer camp and I have some very special things planned.

In addition, each participant will receive a St. John Tiger Basketball to take home at the completion of the camp. I am very excited about this and I am sure the kids will love these.

The main goal of this camp is to get as many kids involved as possible, regardless of playing experience, and to provide a positive learning experience for any level of player, whether they are beginners or experienced players. **Last year, we had 99 kids attend, including many out of town participants.**

Dear Parent,

I am sending this letter out in regards as to whether you wish for your son or daughter to enroll in our summer Drivers Education Program.

In order to help us finalize plans on the number of participants, we need to know by **April 29th, 2019**, if your child will be enrolling. This will allow me to get online information entered and take care of any problems that may arise before the end of school. Students MAY take the course if they turn **14 BEFORE July 1, 2019**. IF they DO NOT turn 14 by then, they will need to wait until the following summer.

Instructional classes will begin July 1st and run through July 8th. We will NOT meet on July 4th. EVERY student must attend 30 hours of classroom, so students may not miss any days of classes. Classes will run from 8:00-11:30 am and then 12:30-4:00 pm daily. Driving will begin, for some, July 8th. The exact dates and times for driving will be sent out once students are confirmed.
