It is exciting to have our school district newsletter back in the works. Mrs. Mixon and students in her Interactive Media class will be publishing the newsletter each month. I'm excited to see what they put together for us throughout the school year.

After a summer of getting somewhat back to normal, we were excited to start the school year in a somewhat normal fashion. That excitement ended quickly when we had several positive cases within our school buildings. In a matter of a few days we discovered around 25 positive cases in our student and staff population. We were forced to close the doors for a few days to slow any chance of spread and because we did not have enough substitutes to cover classrooms.

The board met in their regular October meeting and amended the Covid protocols for the year. Information about those protocols is posted on our website and has been communicated to families. Our goals are very simple: keep students in school and keep everyone safe and healthy. How exactly we go about meeting those goals is not straightforward to say the least.

While we will never have $100 \%$ agreement on any of this, our families have been very supportive and understanding. We can disagree and discuss in a civilized manner. There have been some wild things happening in other communities that we've not seen here. We don't have hateful threats of violence or lawsuits. We have not seen people out of control screaming irrationally at board meetings. We have a great community and for that I am grateful.

- to start out the school year, we do have some great things going on. Miss Kansas 2021, Taylor Clark will be back to her alma mater to present to all of our students on October 13th. Our junior high students have been out in Pratt and Great Bend for job shadowing experiences for career exploration. The house remodel project is rolling along in the second year. We hope to have the house near completion by the end of the school year. This is a small sample of the great things we have going on in spite of the challenges presented by the pandemic.

Daycare is a clear need in our community. We have quality daycares in St. John, but there is still a need for more. Many of our school employees experience difficulties finding childcare, which can affect our ability to recruit and retain great people to work in our schools. Also, many of our preschool parents find it difficult to manage the logistics of getting kids to and from daycare and preschool. For these reasons, the school board is considering facilitating child care options on or near the school campus. We are only in the planning stages at this point and hope to have more information on this soon.

Elections for city and school positions are coming up in November. There are three board of education positions up for election. Those positions are currently occupied by Shawn Ward, Carl Behr, and Vance Fisher and they are all running unopposed.

# MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

It's hard to believe that October is here and we are closing in on the end of a grading quarter. October 14th marks the end of the first quarter of the 20212022 school year and there are a few things for students and parents to keep in mind as that date approaches.

- Progress reports were given to students on Sept. 28 th. These reports on not a final grade and give students an idea of where they are academically in each class.
- If a student is struggling in a class, they should visit with the teacher and come up with a plan to improve their grade.
- We offer after-school tutoring on Monday thru Thursday and strongly encourage students to take advantage of that opportunity. Sometimes students are assigned to go to after-school tutoring.
- For high school students, quarterly grades do not go on transcripts (only semester grades do) but the 1st quarter grade will average with the 2 nd quarter grade to determine semester grades. It is important to achieve as high of a grade as possible each quarter.
- One of the main factors associated with academic success is student attendance. Obviously, if a student is ill we don't want them at school spreading illness to others. However, if a student is absent one way to offset academic loss is to communicate with their teachers about lessons and try to do some work while they are gone.
