I have been hesitant through this Covid mess to provide information on our current situation in my newsletter/newspaper columns. As you know, things change frequently and by the time the article prints, the situation will likely be different. Understanding that things will change rapidly, here is an update on where we are as of the end of January.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) working with the state department of education (KSDE) suspended requirements for contact tracing and quarantines. On one hand this makes me very nervous about spread of the virus. On the other hand, it feels like this might be the beginning of the end.

At this time, we are not identifying close contacts or requiring anyone without symptoms to stay at home. Although testing is still available, it is not required to attend school. The most important thing right now is that those with any symptoms stay home while they are sick. If your child is sick, we ask that you keep him or her at home. Again, testing is also an option.

The 2022 Mid-Winter Classic basketball tournament was a success. The Lion's Club turned the operation of the tournament over to the school district last year. We now have a combined boys' and girls' tournament and will continue that format moving forward.

Last year, was not a normal year and we were very restricted on crowd size. So actually this is the first year we've had a full tournament with unrestricted crowd size. We have formed a committee to help us improve the tournament. It takes a lot of volunteers to help put on this tournament. Our goal is to continue the tradition of a great community-run tournament for many years to come.

The school board is beginning work on a strategic plan for our school district. We have contracted with the Kansas Association of School Boards to assist in the process and facilitate a couple of community meetings in February. We are in the process of gathering volunteers to provide input for the development of this strategic plan. Contact the district office if you are interested in participating.

The district has been dealing with challenges for many years. Issues related to declining enrollment with budget challenges, the Quivira water rights issue, and now Covid have kept us in survival mode for the past decade or so. It is important that we get away from year-to-year survival mode and look toward the future of our school district. Developing a strategic plan is a step in that process.

Early education is an important focus in our district. Our goal is to ensure that every students enters Kindergarten ready to learn. Our district offers free preschool for all students ages 3 and up. All preschool students MUST attend a screening to be eligible to attend our preschool. The screenings help us identify specific student needs and help us plan for the upcoming school year.

There will be a preschool screening on Thursday, March 10th in the library community room from 9:00-1:00. Call 620-672-7500 Ext. 1213 to schedule an appointment. Other screenings are available but this is the only one held in St. John. Contact the elementary office with any questions.

Kindergarten Roundup will be held on April 29th at the Church of Christ. More information about roundup will be coming next month.

Another program that helps ensure students are ready for school is our Parents-As-Teachers program. Johnna Stanford is our PAT director and Carol Siefkes is the PAT educator. They are available to work with families with young children. Please contact the elementary office if you would like more information in the Parents-As-Teachers program.

Biking Across Kansas will have a scheduled stop in St. John this summer. There will be several hundred riders and support people staying overnight on June 13th. There will be opportunities for school and community group fundraisers. This is also a great opportunity to showcase the great things we have going on in our community. Look for more information about this upcoming event.

The Business and FACS classes at USD 350 collaborated to build an end cap display at White's Foodliner.

The Business students made an appointment with White's Foodliner Manager, Heather Long. Isaac Mata interviewed Manager Long to prepare an article for the St. John News. An end cap display was also discussed. The Business Essentials Class made an appointment with Heather Long to discuss a possible Super Bowl end cap display. The Nutrition and Wellness class prepared a chili recipe and the Business Class proposed a nacho recipe. The Nutrition and Wellness classes collaborated to decide on the final recipes.

The Manager and Grocery Manager at White's met with the Business students and approved the chili and nacho recipes and discussed the process for building the end cap. Business Essentials students that met with the managers and planned the display board included Hannah Son, Erynn Cantrell, Braden Salem, and Isac Mata. The students took pictures of each of the proposed ingredients to calculate cost per recipe and cost

per person. Isac Mata prepared the QR codes that link to recipes, cost of ingredients, and nutritional content of recipes. In addition, Isaac Torres and Ryan Eulenstein helped to calculate the costs of each of the recipes. A list of items to order for the end cap was sent to the Grocery Manager. Audrey Willinger and Victor Rosales-Ubanda, Computer Applications, helped create graphics for the display board. Audrey formatted the recipes for display. Patrons may pick up printed copies of the recipes or scan QR codes to access the recipes, cost of recipes, and the nutritional content of the chili and nacho recipes.

The Nutrition and Wellness students reviewed the pictures of the nutrition labels and prepared the nutritional content for each of the recipes. 




